Amending the act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), entitled "An act relating to cities of the third class; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," providing for titles of bills to be read and requiring copies to be available.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1012, act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), known as "The Third Class City Code," reenacted and amended June 28, 1951 (P.L.662, No.164), is amended to read:

Section 1012. Reading of Bills; Final Passage.—[Every] The title of every bill shall be read [at length] when introduced [,] and [may be read by title] on final passage, except as to amendments or other changes which shall be read at length. A complete copy of every bill introduced shall be available for public inspection at the clerk's office during regular office hours. No bill shall be passed finally on the same day on which it was introduced. At least three days shall intervene between its introduction and its final passage. Upon final passage, ordinances shall be numbered serially.
