SB 781

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," further providing for appointment of secretary and treasurer.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 511, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), amended March 28, 1963 (P.L.9, No.6) and June 6, 1963 (P.L.71, No.47), is amended to read:

Section 511. Organization Meeting; Appointment of Secretary and Treasurer.—The supervisors of each township shall meet, at a convenient time and place, on the first Monday in January of each year. If the first Monday is a legal holiday, the meeting shall be held the first day following. At such time the township supervisors shall organize as a board by electing one of their number as chairman and another member as vice-chairman. The board shall appoint a treasurer and a secretary. **[who shall be the same person, and who may or may not be a member of the board, except where the board selects a trust company or a banking institution to act as treasurer, in which case it shall elect an individual as secretary.]** *The secretary shall be an individual, however the board may select either a trust company, banking institution or an individual to serve as treasurer, or the board may appoint one individual to serve as both secretary and treasurer. The secretary-treasurer, secretary or treasurer, may or may not be a member of the board.*

The meeting under this section may be considered as a regular monthly meeting for the transaction of such business as comes before it. The first order of business at this meeting shall be organization of the board. Any action taken or business transacted other than organization of the supervisors as a board at any organization meeting held prior to the effective date of this amending act, which is invalid for the reason that the action was taken or business transacted at an organization meeting, is hereby validated and confirmed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
