A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2304

To the act of July 1, 1981 (P.L.142, No.47), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1981-1982," itemizing public improvement and furniture and equipment projects to be constructed or acquired by the Department of General Services together with their estimated financial cost, authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired by the Department of General Services, stating the estimated useful life of the projects, repealing projects and making appropriations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Itemization and authorization of public improvement projects.

Additional capital budget projects to be constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, are hereby itemized, together with the respective estimated financial cost and the total additional amount authorized for the capital budget projects as follows:

A. Total Authorization.....	\$39,180,000
B. Itemization of Capital Budget Projects:	
I. Department of Commerce.....	\$3,460,000
(1) For the design and construction of a facility for research and development of methods of coal desulfurization. The facility shall be located at a site to be chosen by the Secretary of Commerce in consultation with the Pennsylvania Science and Engineering Foundation.....	\$3,460,000
(Base Construction - \$2,884,000;

II. Department of Education.....	\$35,720,000
(a) The Pennsylvania State University, The Milton S. Hershey Medical Center:	
(1) Hospital addition, including a center for rehabilitation, physical and neurodevelopmental disabilities.....	\$29,600,000
(Base Construction - \$25,000,000;	
Design and Contingencies - \$4,600,000)	
(2) Hospital addition, including an addition of one floor over the existing two story south wing of the hospital, immediately above the present adult psychiatry wing to allow for a child psychiatry unit the same size as the adult psychiatry unit.....	\$2,660,000

- (3) Construction of a multipurpose building to house a gymnasium, auditorium and study facilities at the Wilkes-Barre Campus..... \$3,460,000

Section 2. Debt authorization.

The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$39,180,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the construction of the capital budget projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 3. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness herein authorized shall be incurred from time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed 30 years from the date of the bond first issued for each such series.

Section 4. Appropriation.

(a) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized is hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$39,180,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the capital budget projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay out to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(b) Whenever as determined by the Department of General Services the full estimated financial cost of the capital budget projects itemized in section 1 is not necessary for the proper design or construction of the projects, the excess fund no longer required may be allocated to increase the estimated cost of any one or more of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 5. Federal funds.

In addition to those funds appropriated in section 4, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the construction of the capital budget projects specifically itemized herein are also hereby appropriated for these projects. Any Federal funds received for these projects shall be used to offset State funds allocated for these projects.

Section 6. Transfer of functions.

Upon completion of the capital budget projects itemized in section 1, the functions of the center performed by the Pennsylvania State University at the Elizabethtown Hospital for Children and Youth shall be transferred to the capital budget projects.

Section 7. Repeal.

Projects (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (11), (12), (13), (14) and (15) of paragraph (p) of subclause III of clause B of section 1, act of December 18, 1980 (P.L.1252, No.228), entitled "A supplement to the act of October 6, 1980 (P.L.784, No.145), entitled 'An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1980-1981,' itemizing public improvement and furniture and equipment projects, to be constructed by the Department of General Services and transportation assistance projects to be acquired or constructed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation together with their estimated financial cost; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed by the Department of General Services or Department of Transportation, stating the estimated useful life of the projects; providing for the adoption of capital projects to be financed from current revenues of the Boating Fund and the Fish Fund and making an appropriation," are repealed.

Section 8. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
