Repealing certain acts relating to gypsies.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Repeals.

The following acts are repealed:

The act of May 6, 1909 (P.L.445, No.247), entitled "An act to require roving bands of nomads, commonly called gypsies, and the persons composing such bands, who have no permanent place of abode in this Commonwealth, to take out a license to pitch or settle their encampments, or carry on their transactions or practice their craft, within the limits of any county of this State, fixing the amount of such license, and prescribing the penalty for violation of the same."

The act of April 7, 1927 (P.L.144, No.114), entitled "An act authorizing boards of health to require roving bands, or bands of nomads, commonly called gypsies, declared to be nuisances or menaces to health, to leave municipalities, and providing penalties."

Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
