A SUPPLEMENT

SB 572

To the act of May 13, 1999 (P.L.64, No.6), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1999-2000," itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects, redevelopment assistance and redevelopment assistance capital projects, flood control projects, Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation projects and forestry bridge projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission or the Pennsylvania Game Commission, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Community and Economic Development or the Department of Transportation; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; authorizing certain waivers; making appropriations; and making repeals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1999-2000.

Section 2. Total authorizations.

(a) Public improvements.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$1,970,833,000.

(b) Furniture and equipment.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 4 and to be acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$91,657,000.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$980,555,000.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance and redevelopment assistance capital projects itemized in section 6 for capital

grants by the Department of Community and Economic Development, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$3,578,353,000.

(e) Flood control.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of flood control projects itemized in section 7 and to be constructed by the Department of Environmental Protection, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$61,958,000.

(f) Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation projects itemized in section 8 and to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns, and to be financed from revenues in the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund shall be \$128,649,000.

(g) Game Fund projects.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 9 to be acquired by the Pennsylvania Game Commission and to be financed from current revenues of the Game Fund pursuant to executive authorizations shall be \$1,927,000.

(h) Fish and Boat Fund projects.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 10 to be acquired or developed by the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and to be financed from current revenues of the Boat Fund and the Fish Fund pursuant to executive authorization shall be \$5,200,000.

(i) State forestry bridge projects.—The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of State forestry bridge projects itemized in section 11 to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by oil company franchise tax revenues pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. § 9502(a)(2)(iv) (relating to imposition of tax) shall be \$31,228,000.

(j) Drug forfeiture funds projects.—The total authorization for the capital project in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 12 to be acquired or developed by the Department of General Services for the Pennsylvania State Police, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by drug forfeiture revenues shall be \$300,000.

Section 3. Itemization of public improvement projects.

Additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects to be constructed or acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt are hereby itemized, together with their respective estimated financial costs, as follows:

Section 13. Limited waiver of local requirements.

(a) Waivers for current itemizations.—The limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) (relating to program authorizations) shall be totally waived for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects for mass transit contained in section 5(a)(9)(iii), (iv), (xii), (xviii), (xix), (xx) and (xxi), (10)(xii), (xiii) and (xiv) and (11)(vii) and (viii).

(b) Limited waiver of local requirement for 1997 itemization.—Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) shall be totally waived for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects for mass transit contained in section 5(a)(16)(xxxi) and (xxxii) of the act of October 10, 1997 (P.L.392, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1996-1997.

(c) Waiver for 1993-1994 itemization.—The limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) shall be totally waived for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects for mass transit contained in section 5(a)(20)(iv) and (21)(vii) and those portions of section 5(a)(26) and (27) which are vehicle safety and overhaul.

(d) Waiver for 1992 itemization.—

(1) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there shall be no local match funding requirement for the national magnetic levitation prototype proposal and development phase as described in section 5(b)(15)(i)(A) of the act of December 28, 1992 (P.L.1694, No.188), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 1991-1992.

(2) The Department of Transportation shall select a contractor for the project described in section 5(b)(15)(i)(A) of the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 1991-1992. Such selection shall be based on the following criteria: the contractor must have extensive knowledge of magnetic levitation technology and have been incorporated in this Commonwealth for at least two years for the express purpose of developing magnetic levitation technology. The contractor must also have demonstrated an ability to attract private sector investment, including corporate and labor participation, as well as Federal, State and local funding for magnetic levitation development.

(e) Increase of limitation.—The limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) may be increased to one-half of the net project costs for the North Shore Central Business District Transportation Project contained in section 5(a)(9)(ix) of this act.

Section 14. Debt authorization.

(a) Public improvements.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in

addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$1,970,833,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(b) Furniture and equipment.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$91,657,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$980,555,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—Subject to the limitation in section 1616.1-B(b) of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$3,578,353,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance and the redevelopment capital assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(e) Flood control.—The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$61,958,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 15. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness authorized in this act shall be incurred from time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 16.

Section 16. Estimated useful life and term of debt.

(a) Estimated useful life.—The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects itemized in this act is as follows:

- (1) Public improvement projects, 30 years.
- (2) Furniture and equipment projects, 10 years.
- (3) Transportation assistance projects:
 - (i) Rolling stock, 15 years.
 - (ii) Passenger buses, 12 years.
 - (iii) Furniture and equipment, 10 years.
 - (iv) All others, 30 years.

(b) Term of debt.—The maximum term of the debt authorized to be incurred under this act is 30 years.

Section 17. Appropriations.

(a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$1,970,833,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$91,657,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$980,555,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community and Economic Development in the maximum amount of \$3,578,353,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance and redevelopment capital assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After

reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community and Economic Development the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(e) Flood control.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection in the maximum amount of \$61,958,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Environmental Protection the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

Section 18. Federal funds.

(a) Projects itemized in this act.—In addition to those funds appropriated in section 17, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this act are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

(b) Projects not requiring itemization.—Department of Military and Veterans Affairs construction projects which are totally federally funded but which are to be administered by the Department of General Services are hereby authorized.

(c) Projects to be completed with Federal funds only.—Federal funds in the amount of \$3,548,000 are authorized for the construction of an organization maintenance shop at Johnstown for the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. Federal funds in the amount of \$6,862,000 are authorized for the construction of an organization maintenance shop at Pittsburgh for the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.

Section 19. Federal funds.

In addition to those funds appropriated in section 18, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this act are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

Section 20. Conditions and limitations on certain capital projects.

(a) Department of Transportation Magnetic Levitation Project.—The program provided for in section 3(16)(xiii) shall be developed in conjunction with the project referenced in the Federal Legislation Conference Report 105-550, Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, TEA-21, Section 1218(d)(4), dated May 22, 1998.

(b) Change in the use of funds.—Funds authorized in section 3(6)(xii)(A) of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.265, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1993-1994, for the Pennsylvania Military Museum Visitor Center may be used for a general expansion of the Pennsylvania Military Museum.

(c) Change of location of institution.—Notwithstanding the provisions of section 3(4)(x)(A) of the act of October 10, 1997 (P.L.392, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1996-1997, the construction

of a new close-security institution with a capacity of approximately 1,236 cells does not have to occur within a 50-mile radius of the existing institution.

Section 21. Department of Corrections authorization.

The Department of Corrections is authorized, subject to executive approval and authorization, to construct the headquarters/conference facility itemized in section 3 by contract awarded by the Department of General Services or to acquire the headquarters/conference facility by means of a lease with an option to purchase. If the Department of Corrections elects the lease/purchase option, it shall advertise for proposals and shall award the contract based on the best interests of this Commonwealth to a responsive and responsible bidder.

Section 22. Redevelopment assistance capital projects.

(a) Requirements for.—

(1) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the requirements of section 318 of the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, shall provide the sole and exclusive requirements for bidding for the construction or renovation of a redevelopment assistance capital project authorized in a capital budget itemization act on or before the effective date of this act.

(2) Any public authority shall be eligible to contract with the Commonwealth to receive funds for the construction or renovation of a redevelopment assistance capital project authorized in a capital budget itemization act on or before the effective date of this act.

(b) Construction.—Nothing in this section shall be construed to override or abrogate any provision of the act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Steel Products Procurement Act.

Section 23. Expiration of authorization and appropriation.

(a) General rule.—The authorization and appropriation for the additional capital projects itemized in sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 for which construction contracts have not been executed within four years of the effective date of this act shall expire upon such date and shall be considered repealed. The Secretary of the Budget may extend an expired project for up to one year upon written notification of the majority chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the majority chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives. Upon expiration of the extension period, an extended project may not be subsequently extended.

(b) Reports.—Whenever the authorization and appropriation for the additional capital projects itemized under this act shall expire pursuant to subsection (a) or whenever the authorization and appropriation for the additional capital projects itemized under the act of October 10, 1997 (P.L.392, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1996-1997, shall expire pursuant to section 20 of said act, the Secretary of the Budget shall, within 30 days of the date of expiration, provide to the

majority and minority chairmen of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the majority and minority chairmen of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives a report itemizing all capital projects which have expired. Such report shall contain specific references to the section of the act wherein the projects were itemized and shall include the project location, project description and authorized project amount. The report shall also aggregate the total dollar amount of expired projects by capital project category.

Section 24. Repeals.

The following acts and parts of acts are repealed:

Section 3(3)(i)(A) of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.265, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1993-1994.

Sections 5(b)(6)(i)(A) and 6(29)(ii)(A) of the act of July 8, 1994 (P.L.444, No.74), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1994-1995.

Section 3(1)(xiv)(A) of the act of July 6, 1995 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1051, No.19), known as the 1995 Special Session Corrections and Secure Facilities Capital Budget Project Itemization Act.

Sections 6(2)(iii)(F) and (H), (15)(ii)(C) and (36)(i) and 8(1)(xiv)(A) of the act of October 10, 1997 (P.L.392, No.47), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act for 1996-1997.

Section 368(a)(3) of the act of June 18, 1998 (P.L.537, No.78), known as the Highway Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 1996-1997.

Section 25. Editorial changes.

In editing and preparing this act for printing following the final enactment, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall insert or revise letters or numbers for projects where the letters or numbers are missing or require revision. The bureau shall also revise the total monetary amounts for the total authorization, debt authorization, appropriations and departmental totals as necessary to agree with the total monetary amounts of the projects.

Section 26. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.

APPROVED—The 25th day of June, A.D. 1999, except as to the following:

Section 17. Appropriations.

(a) Public improvements.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$1,970,833,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$1,371,473,000.

(b) Furniture and equipment.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$91,657,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$79,227,000.

(c) Transportation assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$980,555,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$734,469,000.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community and Economic Development in the maximum amount of \$3,578,353,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance and redevelopment capital assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community and Economic Development the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$3,358,257,000.

(e) Flood control.—The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection in the maximum amount of \$61,958,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Environmental Protection the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

This item is approved in the sum of \$16,338,000.

I have withheld my approval from parts of the above appropriations because projects have been included in this bill which cannot be legally implemented or which are duplicate projects either approved in previous capital project authorization acts or within Senate Bill 572. Some projects contained in the bill do not meet the definitions of a capital project in the category of project where they are listed, and the Commonwealth may not, therefore, legally fund those projects under the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act.

In addition, there are a great number of projects contained in Senate Bill 572 which have vague or unclear descriptions. Although I have not vetoed these, I strongly recommend that the Legislature provide better descriptions of projects in the future. Inadequately described projects may be subject to future veto for vagueness and lack of specific description.

A number of the projects in the Redevelopment Assistance Capital category may not meet the minimum total project amount of \$1 million. While I have not vetoed them from Senate Bill 572, any project which is not over \$1 million in total costs cannot be funded. In future capital bills passed by the Legislature, unless the total project cost is indicated, I intend to approve only those projects which are in the bill for \$250,000 or more on the assumption that most projects will be requesting at least one quarter of the total project funds from the Commonwealth. These items again point out the necessity for detailed descriptions of projects included in the bill since adequately described projects, including total project cost, would avoid uncertainty about whether the project should be authorized.

Substantial capital project itemization acts have been passed in the last several years. It is beyond reasonable expectations that all projects approved in prior acts, in addition to those contained in Senate Bill 572, could be financed and also maintain the Commonwealth's current financial strength.

This Administration remains committed to maintaining the Commonwealth's financial integrity though exercising restraint in the amount of new construction and other capital projects undertaken. Therefore, many projects in Senate Bill 572 will not be undertaken.

Senate Bill 572 and the previous capital project itemization act, Act 1997-47, contain a provision which will automatically repeal any project not under construction within four years of the effective date of the act. This will serve to reduce the amount of debt authorized that has been substantially increased due to the passage of capital project authorizations of such large magnitudes as Senate Bill 572 and Act 1997-47. Therefore, the increase in project authorizations in this bill should not have as negative an impact on our bond rating, as might otherwise occur.

The bill contains one math error in the category of Redevelopment Assistance Capital. The total shown for this category is \$1,000,000 more than the total of the projects in that category. I have therefore made an adjustment

to the total amount approved to account for this difference. In addition, two projects in the category of Public Improvement will be funded using current revenue of the General Fund. They are capital projects and therefore need to be itemized in a capital budget but funds for these projects were contained in the General Appropriation Act of 1999. They are the Veterans Memorial at the National Cemetery for \$2.5 million (under the Department of Veterans and Military Affairs) and the indoor firearms training center for \$3 million (under the State Police). I have therefore made an adjustment to the amount approved in this category to account for this.

As in previous item vetoes of capital project authorization acts, I am listing those projects that will not be undertaken. These are:
