CHAPTER L

An ACT to revive the act, entitled "A supple-"ment to the act, entitled "An act to extend "the Powers of the Justices of the Peace of this "State."

Section 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act, entitled "A supplement to the act, entitled "An act to extend the powers of the justices of the peace of this state," passed the first day of March, one thousand seven hundred ninety-nine, and every matter therein contained (except the limitation thereof) be, and the same is hereby revived and made perpetual.
