CHAPTER XXXIII.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act for establishing a nightly watch, providing lamps and supporting pumps for publicuse in the borough of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster, passed the fourth day of April one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.
