Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the pass- Part of Conefing of this act, Conedogwinit creek, from the dogwinit creek Cove-fording to the Franklin county line, shall lichighway. be, and the fame is hereby declared to be a public highway, for the passage of boats and rafts along the same, and it shall and may be lawful for the inhabitants defirous of improving or using the navigation of the said creek, to remove all natural and artificial obstructions from belo₩

below the Cove-ford, on faid creek, to the Franklin county line aforefaid: Provided, That in doing the fame they shall not thereby do any damage to private property.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That nothing in this act conperions hold- tained shall be deemed, taken or understood, to prevent any person or persons possessing land erect dams not on faid creek, who, before the passing of this act had authority under the law of this commonwealth to erect a dam or dams, from erecting the fame, as he, she or they may think proper: Provided, That fuch dam or dams be fo constructed and kept in repair by the owners thereof, with complete flopes and locks on convenient parts of fuch dams, as that the navigation of faid creek for boats and rafts will not be injured, nor the passing of fish prevented.
