## CHAPTER CXVI.

## An ACT to diffolve the Marriage Contract between Thomas Dewces and Mary his Wife.

THEREAS Mary Dewees, late Mary Kid, of the county of Montgomery, by her petition, hath reprefented to the legislature, that she was lawfully married to Thomas Dewees, in the month of June Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and one; that within a few months after their marriage, he was convicted of forgery, in the court of over and terminer, in Berks county, and was fentenced to hard labour and imprisonment for a term of years; that after eighteen months imprisonment he was, at the folicitation of her friends, pardoned by the Governor; that after remaining with her about two weeks after his liberation, he abandoned and left her in a deftitute fituation; and it appears by a copy of a record of the court of quarter feffions of the peace, and general

neral jail delivery for the county of Allegheny, that at the faid court holden the twenty-eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and three, the faid Thomas Dewees was legally convicted of aiding and abetting the paffing of counterfeit money, and fentenced to five years imprifonment at hard labour : And whereas it appears to the legiflature, that under fuch circumstances the unfortunate woman cught to be releafed from any connection with a character apparently fo irreclaimable : Therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and Houfe of Reprefentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennfylvania, in General Affembly met, and it is The marriage hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, That tween Thomas the marriage contract between Thomas Dewees and Mary his wife, late Mary Kid, be and the Mary Dewees, fame is hereby declared to be null and void, and they are hereby declared to be feparated, fet free and totally difcharged from the matrimonial contract, and from all duties and obligations arifing therefrom, as fully, effectually, and abfolutely, as if they had never been joined in matrimony, any law, cuftom or ufage to the contrary notwithstanding.
