CHAPTER CXXII.

An ACT for the Punishment of Perjury, or Subornation of Perjury.

Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennfylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the fame, That every perfon who shall Penalty on commit perjury or fuborn, or procure any per- committing fon to commit perjury, by wilfully and fallely ornation of fwearing or affirming, fhall, upon being there-perjury. of convicted in any court of law within this commonwealth, forfeit and pay any fum not exceeding five hundred dollars, and fuffer imprifonment, and be kept at hard labour during any term not exceeding feven years, at the difcretion of the court before whom fuch conviction shall be had; and further, shall thereafter be difqualified from holding any office of honour, truft or profit in this commonwealth, and from being admitted as a legal witnefs in any matter of controverly.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That fo much of any law as Repeal of fo is hereby altered or fupplied, be and they are much of any former law as hereby repealed.
