CHAPTER CVII.

A supplement to the several Lets of Assembly of this commonwealth, relating to the acknowledgment or proof of deeds and other curitings.

Section 1. E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvanic, in General As-Sembly

sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That each of the aldermen of the city of Philadelphia, shall have full power Aldermen of to take and receive the acknowledgment or Philadelphia proof of all deeds, conveyances, mortgages impowered to and other instruments of writing, touching or knowledgment concerning any lands, tenements, or heredita- of deeds, &c. ments, fituate, lying, and being within the city and county of Philadelphia; and also power to take and receive the separate examination of any feme covert, touching or concerning her right of dower, or the conveyance of her estate, or right in, or to any fuch lands, tenements, or hereditaments agreeably to the act of Assembly, entitled, "An act for the better confirmation of the estates of persons holding or claiming under feme coverts; and for establishing a mode by which husband and wife may hereafter convey their estates," passed on the twenty-fourth day of February, Anno Domini, one thousand seven hundred and feventy.
