### CHAPTER CL.

An ACT for the relief of John Welch.

W HEREAS it hath been reprefented to the Legiflature that John Welch now an inhabitant of Butler county, entered the fervice of this country as a private foldier for three years, or during the war in captain John M'Dowell's company, in the feventh regiment of the Pennfylvania line, commanded by lieutenant colonel John Greer; and at the battle of Germantown, he received a fevere wound in his left fhoulder, by reafon of which and his advanced age he is now incapable of maintaining himfelf and family, and as it appears to the Legiflature that his claim is well founded: Therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, That the officers of the land-office are hereby The land ofauthorifed and required to issue a patent to John rifed to issue a Welch, of Butler county, for fuch quantity of patent, for dodonation land as he would have been entitled to to John Welch, had he ferved to the end of the war.
