CHAPTER XXVIII.

An ACT for the relief of Doctor Samuel Edmiston.

WHEREAS it appears, that Doctor Samuel Edmiston entered into the service of his country, in the year, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven, as a surgeon, and attended the sick and wounded on board of the armed vessels of war, that from this service he was ordered to accompany the flying camp, and from thence to attend at the general hospital, where he continued in his capacity as aforesaid until the termination of the war: *And whereas it appears by his receipt on file for the depreciation of his pay, that the petitioner was considered as a member of the army, during the war, and from his service as aforesaid, he is entitled to be placed upon the same footing as the officers and soldiers of the line:* Therefore,

SECTION I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the board of property be, and they are hereby authorized to grant to Doctor Samuel Edmiston, a patent for such quantity of donation land, as surgeons in the Pennsylvania line were by law entitled to receive.*
