## AN ACT

Providing for the salaries of court criers and tipstaves of the several courts in counties of the fourth class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That in counties of the fourth class, the salaries of the court criers shall be fixed by the judges of the several courts, and shall not exceed one thousand six hundred and fifty dollars per annum; and the salaries of tipstaves shall not exceed one thousand five hundred dollars per annum. Such salaries shall be payable out of the county treasury in the manner now provided by law.

Section 2. The act, approved the twelfth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, two hundred and ninety-three), entitled "An act to amend an act, entitled 'An act to regulate the fees of tipstaves in judicial districts containing more than one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants, and less than five hundred thousand inhabitants,' approved the fifth day of March, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and three; by further regulating the salary of tipstaves and court criers in judicial districts containing more than one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants, and less than two hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants," is hereby repealed in so far as the same relates to court criers. All other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are repealed.

## AN ACT

To amend section eight hundred three of an act, approved the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred eleven (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred nine), entitled "An act to establish a public school system in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, together with the provisions by which it shall be administered, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof; providing revenue to establish and maintain the same, and the method of collecting such revenue; and repealing all laws, general, special, or local, or any parts thereof, that are or may be inconsistent therewith."

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section eight hundred three of an act, approved the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred eleven (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred nine), entitled "An act to establish

a public school system in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, together with the provisions by which it shall be administered, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof; providing revenue to establish and maintain the same, and the method of collecting such revenue; and repealing all laws, general, special, or local, or any parts thereof, that are or may be inconsistent therewith," which reads as follows:—

Section 803, act of May 13, 1911 (P. L. 509), cite for amendment.

"Section 803. It shall be the duty of school directors in each county of this Commonwealth to attend such annual convention of school directors called by the county superintendent, and each school director attending such convention shall receive, for his necessary expenses, the sum of *two* dollars (\$2.00) per day for each day's attendance, and mileage at the rate of *three* cents per mile for the distance necessary to be traveled in going to and from such convention, once each year. Said amount shall be paid by an order drawn on the treasurer of the school district in which he acts as school director: Provided, however, That no school director shall be paid for more than two days at any annual convention," is hereby amended to read as follows:—

Proviso.

Section 803. It shall be the duty of school directors in each county of this Commonwealth to attend such annual convention of school directors called by the county superintendent, and each school director attending such convention shall receive, for his necessary expenses, the sum of *four* dollars (\$4.00) per day for each day's attendance, and mileage at the rate of *four* cents per mile for the distance necessary to be traveled in going to and from such convention, once each year. Said amount shall be paid by an order drawn on the treasurer of the school district in which he acts as school director: Provided, however, That no school director shall be paid for more than two days at any annual convention.
