AN ACT

Requiring the county commissioners, in all counties of the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth class of this Commonwealth, to provide an office at the county-seat for the district attorney and his assistants, if any, and to furnish supplies, postage, telephone, fuel, and light required for his and their use.

Counties of the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the county commissioners in all counties of the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth class of this Commonwealth shall provide an office for the district attorney and his assistants, if any, in the court-house at the county-seat, and, in case no such office is available in the court-house, they shall, at the cost of the county, provide an office in a suitable and conveniently located building at the county-seat, to be selected by them, and shall, at the cost of the county, furnish the office furniture, telephone, blank books, blanks, dockets, supplies, postage and stationery required for the use of the district attorney and his assistants, if any, and all needed fuel and light.

AN ACT

To amend section twenty-four of an act, approved the seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and fifteen), entitled "An act relating to the qualification, jurisdiction, powers, and duties of registers of wills, and regulating proceedings before said registers, and the costs thereof, the effects of their acts, and appeals therefrom"

Registers of wills.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section twenty-four of the act, approved the seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and fifteen), entitled "An act relating to the qualification, jurisdiction, powers, and duties of registers of wills, and regulating proceedings before said registers, and the costs thereof, the effects of their acts, and appeals therefrom," which reads as follows:—

Section 24, act of June 7, 1917 (P. L. 415), cited for amendment.

"Section 24. On the probate of any will and the granting of letters testamentary thereon, also on the granting of any letters of administration, every register shall demand and receive, for the use of the Commonwealth, in each case, the sum of *fifty cents*," is hereby amended to read as follows:—
