

expenses of any such soldier, sailor, or marine, where the total expense of any such funeral, including said allowance of seventy-five dollars, shall exceed *two* hundred *and fifty* dollars," is hereby amended to read as follows:—

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the county commissioners in each county are hereby authorized and directed to expend the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75) from the county funds towards the funeral expenses of any widow of any person who served in the Army or Navy of the United States during any war in which the United States was engaged; or served in the Army or Navy of the United States where a state or condition of war existed in the United States, or any foreign country or territory, or upon the high seas; or who was in active service of the militia of the State of Pennsylvania, under and in pursuance of any proclamations issued by the Governor, during the Civil War, and not duly mustered into the service of the United States; and who was honorably discharged or relieved from such service, upon due proof being made of such facts: Provided, however, That the county commissioners shall not contribute any moneys toward the funeral expenses of any such widow of a soldier, sailor, or marine where the total expense of any such funeral, including said allowance of seventy-five dollars, shall exceed *three* hundred dollars.

AN ACT

Fixing the salary of the deputy county engineer in counties of the second class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the salary of the deputy county engineer in counties of the second class shall be, and the same is hereby, fixed at the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) per annum, payable in monthly or semimonthly instalments out of the county treasury.
