## AN ACT

To amend section one of an act, entitled "An act to facilitate the labors of the judges of the court of common pleas of the county in which the seat of government is or may be located, in the disposition of the business of the Commonwealth, by providing suitable clerical assistance," approved the seventeenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (Pamphlet Laws, twenty-one).

Common pleas

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., 'That section one of an act, entitled "An act to facilitate the labors of the judges of the court of common pleas of the county in which the seat of government is or may be located, in the disposition of the business of the Commonwealth, by providing suitable clerical assistance," approved the seventeenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, which reads as follows:—

Section 1, act of April 17, 1893 (P. L. 21), cited for amendment.

"Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That to facilitate the labors of the judges of the court of common pleas of the county in which the seat of government is or may be located in the disposition of the business of the Commonwealth, the said judges are hereby authorized to employ the help of stenographers, typewriters and other clerks, provided the cost of such help shall not exceed the sum of one thousand dollars per annum for each of said judges, the cost of such help to be paid by the judge employing the same, and shall be repaid to him by the State Treasurer upon his certificate of the amount paid by him during the preceding three months for such help," be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:—

Judges.

Clerical assistance.

Payment.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That to facilitate the labors of the judges of the court of common pleas of the county in which the seat of government is or may be located in the disposition of the business of the Commonwealth, the said judges are hereby authorized to employ the help of stenographers, typewriters and other clerks, provided the cost of such help shall not exceed the sum of twenty-four hundred dollars per annum for each of said judges. The cost of such help shall be paid by the judge employing the same, and shall be repaid to him upon his certificate of the amount paid by him during the preceding month to be made upon the requisition for salaries as provided by law.
