## AN ACT

To amend the first section of an act, entitled "An act to amend the first section of an act, entitled 'An act increasing the salaries of tipstaves in the courts of any county in this Commonwealth having a population of not less than five hundred thousand, approved the thirtieth day of May, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, by changing the limit of population of such counties, and increasing the minimum and maximum limits of said salaries," approved the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, by limiting the provisions of said act to counties of the first class, and providing for the salaries of such tipstaves.

Countles of the first class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of an act, approved the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, entitled "An act to amend the first section of an act, entitled 'An act increasing the salaries of tipstaves in the courts of any county in this Commonwealth having a population of not less than five hundred thousand,' approved the thirtieth day of May, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, by changing the limit of population of such counties and increasing the minimum and maximum limits of said salaries," which reads as follows:—

Section 1, act of May 30, 1895 (P. L. 128), as amended by section 1, act of June 1, 1911 (P. L. 623), cited for amendment. "Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That from and after the first day of June, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the salary or compensation of each tipstaff, employed in the courts of any county in this Commonwealth having a population of not less than one million five hundred thousand, shall not be less than one thousand eight hundred dollars nor exceeding two thousand dollars per annum, and shall be paid in the same manner as such tipstaves are now paid," be, and the same is hereby, amended so as to read:—

Tipstaves.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That from and after the passage of this act, each tipstaff of any county of the first class of this Commonwealth shall receive, out of the county treasury, such annual salary as the appointing court shall fix: Provided, That the salary paid shall not exceed twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500) per annum.
