Records may be typewritten.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That all borough records required to be recorded or transcribed shall be deemed valid if typewritten, and all records heretofore recorded or transcribed by typewriter are validated.

AN ACT

To amend section one of an act, approved the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and thirty-eight), entitled "An act authorizing corporations incorporated under the laws of any other State of the United States to acquire, use, encumber, and dispose of such real estate, and rights, and interests in, in the nature of or in respect to real estate, in Fennsylvania, as may be necessary and proper for the exercise of such of their corporate purposes as it may be lawful for them to exercise in this State; defining certain of their powers, rights, and liabilities in connection therewith; regulating the exercise of said rights by foreign public service corporations; repealing certain acts; and validating certain titles, rights, and interests heretofore acquired." by extending its provisions to corporations incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia or by Act of Congress.
