AN ACT

To further amend section ten of an act, approved the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one (Pamphlet Laws, eighty-eight), entitled "An act relating to replevin, and regulating the practice in cases where the writ of replevin is issued," by providing for the discharge of bonds in replevin cases after failure to bring action thereon.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section ten of an act, approved the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one (Pamphlet Laws, eighty-eight), entitled "An act relating to replevin, and regulating the practice in cases where the writ of replevin is issued," which was amended by section two of an act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three (Pamphlet Laws, fourteen), entitled "An act to amend sections five and ten of the act, approved the nineteenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and one (Pamphlet Laws, eighty-eight), entitled 'An act relating to replevin, and regulating the practice in cases where the writ of replevin is issued,'" is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 10. No action shall be brought upon any bond given in accordance with the provisions of this act, unless commenced within a year and a day after the final determination of the suit in which the bond was given. *At the expiration of such period, if no action has been brought thereon, the said bond shall be discharged.*
