Section 1 of act of April 20, 1921 (P. L. 750), amended.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of the act, approved the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred and fifty,) entitled "An act to amend the first section of an act, entitled 'An act to amend the first section of an act, entitled "An act increasing the salaries of tipstaves in the courts of any county in this Commonwealth having a population of not less than five hundred thousand," approved the thirtieth day of May. Salaries of tipstaves.

Proviso.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That from and after the passage of this act, each [tipstaff] tipstave of any county of the first class of this Commonwealth shall receive, out of the county treasury, such annual salary as the appointing court shall fix: Provided, That the salary paid shall not exceed [twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500)] three thousand dollars (\$3,000) per annum,
