Pennsylvania has heretofore or shall hereafter, in proceedings relating to the elimination of grade crossing or crossings, order and direct the opening of a new highway (where no legally opened highway existed before), in order to afford a proper approach to a subway, bridge or viaduct, such newly opened highway and the road leading therefrom and to said subway, bridge or viaduct are adopted by the Commonwealth as State highways, to be constructed and maintained at the sole expense of the Commonwealth, under the provisions of the present or future laws governing main highways: Provided, Proviso. however, That, at the time of making the order relating to said highways, the Public Service Commission shall have the right to direct that said road shall be opened and maintained at the expense of the city, borough, incorporated town, or township in which said roads are located.

Section 2. Unless otherwise ordered as provided in section one of this act, the cost and expense of the maintenance, construction, and improvement of the highways herein described shall be paid out of any moneys appropriated to the State Highway Department for maintenance, reconstruction or improvement of highways.
