make such [appropriation] appropriations [thereto] as may be necessary; and the said board of health, Report. health officer, or officers, shall, in the month of January of each year, submit a report, in writing, to [councils] council or the township commissioners of its [operations] appropriation and expenditures for the preceding year, together with such other information on subjects relative to the sanitary conditions or requirements of the borough or township as may be necessary, and [councils] council or township commissioners shall publish the same in their official journal.

Section 4. That the said act is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

Section 9-A

Section 9-A. Any borough or first class township may cooperate with the county, or with any city in the county in which such borough or first class township is located, as well as with the State Department of Health, in the administration and enforcement of health laws.

AN ACT

To provide for the care and treatment of the indigent insane of the several counties of the Commonwealth, in the State and semi-State hospitals for the insane.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the expense of the care and treatment of the indigent insane, whether chronic or otherwise, in the State and semi-State hospitals for the insane, is hereby fixed at the uniform rate of three dollars per week for each person, including clothing, chargeable to the respective county or nance. poor district from which such insane person shall come, and the excess over said three dollars per week shall be paid by the State; but in no case shall said excess exceed three dollars per week for each indigent insane person.
