## AN ACT

Authorizing the council, the commission of water works, or other body in charge of water works property, in third class cities, to lease real property and water areas not necessary or essential for the operation or maintenance of the water works.

Cities of  
third class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That it shall be lawful for the council, or the commission of water works, or other body of any city of the third class having charge and control of the water works property of any such city, to lease, for a period of years, subject to proper restrictions, any portion of the real property, not exceeding three acres, and any water
