Notice of the intention to apply for any such charter [shall be inserted in two newspapers of general circulation, printed in the proper county, for three weeks, setting forth briefly the character and object of the corporation to be formed, and the intention to make application therefor.] shall be published one time in two newspapers, one of which shall be a newspaper of general circulation, and the other the legal newspaper, if any, designated by the rules of court for the publication of legal notices, otherwise in two newspapers of general circulation printed in the proper county: Provided, That, where there is but one newspaper of general circulation published in any county, the publication of notice in such newspaper shall be sufficient. Notice shall be published at least three days prior to the day fixed in the advertisement for the presentation of the application to the Governor, and shall set forth briefly, the character and object of the proposed corporation to be formed, and the intention to make application therefor.
