To repeal an act, approved the seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five) (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred and twenty-three), entitled "An act to designate the several judicial districts of the Commonwealth as required by the Constitution."

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the act, approved the seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five) (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred and twenty-three), entitled "An act to designate the several judicial districts of the Commonwealth as required by the Constitution," is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To repeal section eight of the act, approved the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred thirty-six (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred thirty-nine), entitled "An act relating to the support and employment of the poor," by repealing the eighth section of said act.

Poor law.

Section 8 of act
of June 13, 1836
(P. L. 539), re-
pealed.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the eighth section of an act, approved the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred and thirty-nine), entitled "An act relating to the support and employment of the poor," which reads as follows:

Apprentices.

"Section 8. It shall be lawful for the overseers of every district, with the approbation and consent of two or more magistrates of the same county, to put out as apprentices all poor children whose parents are dead or by the said magistrate found to be unable to maintain them, so as that the time or term of years of such apprenticeship, if a male, do expire at or before the age of twenty-one years and, if a female, at or before the age of eighteen years," be and the same is hereby repealed.
