AN ACT

To further amend section two thousand six hundred and twenty-three of an act, approved the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred nine), entitled "An act to establish a public school system in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, together with the provisions by which it shall be administered, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof; providing revenue to establish and maintain the same, and the method of collecting such revenue; and repealing all laws, general, special, or local, or any parts thereof, that are or may be inconsistent therewith," as amended; so as to allow the court of common pleas to fix the compensation of auditors of school districts of the second class, and providing for assistants and other expenses.

Section 1. Section 2623. The compensation for auditors, in school Compensation of districts of the second [and third] class, shall, together of second class. with suitable allowances for qualified assistants and for other necessary expenses, be fixed by the board of school directors of said districts on application from time to time made by the auditors, with itemized statements of services, assistants, and other necessary expenses; and in school districts of the third class the compensation for auditors shall be five dollars auditors in districts (\$5.00) per day for each day necessarily spent by each auditor; and the total expense of such auditing, including Expense of audit the cost of filing the report, advertising, and other necessary

Compensation of of third class.

Accountants in districts of second class. costs, shall be paid by the school district. The compensation of any certified public accountants employed by any school district of the second class shall be fixed by the directors of such district and paid by the district.
