ther, That the total amount of all indebtedness *incurred* or created without the assent of the electors in any school district issuing such obligations shall not, at any time, including all such obligations, exceed two per centum of the total valuation of the taxable property therein: Provided further, That any school district incurring any temporary debt and issuing such obligations, in the manner herein provided, shall provide from its current revenue for the payment of the same, except such temporary debt as may be outstanding on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and [twenty-five] twentysix, and which, by the provisions of section five hundred and six, may be refunded by an issue of bonds.

## AN ACT

To amend section four hundred and ten of the act, approved the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred and nine), entitled "An act to establish a public school system in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, together with the provisions by which it shall be administered, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof; providing revenue to establish and maintain the same, and the method of collecting such revenue; and repealing all laws, general, special, or local, or any parts thereof, that are or may be inconsistent therewith," as amended; providing for the appointment and the payment of the expenses of secretaries as delegates to State conventions or associations of school directors.
