Proviso.

ther, That the total amount of all indebtedness incurred or created without the assent of the electors in any school district issuing such obligations shall not, at any time, including all such obligations, exceed two per centum of the total valuation of the taxable property therein: Provided further, That any school district incurring any temporary debt and issuing such obligations, in the manner herein provided, shall provide from its current revenue for the payment of the same, except such temporary debt as may be outstanding on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and [twenty-five] twenty-six, and which, by the provisions of section five hundred and six, may be refunded by an issue of bonds.
