## AN ACT

To amend section one hundred and eight of the act, approved the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred and eighty-two), entitled "An act to consolidate, revise, and amend the penal laws of this Commonwealth," by providing that any bailee shall be guilty of larceny if he wilfully fails to return the bailed property to the owner in accordance with his agreement with the owner thereof, or destroys the same, or permits it to be destroyed.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one hundred and eight of the act, approved the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred and eighty-two), entitled "An act to consolidate, revise, and amend the penal laws of this Commonwealth," be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Larceny by bailee.

Section 108. If any person, being a bailee of any property, shall fraudulently take or convert the same to his own use, or to the use of any other person except the owner thereof, or shall wilfully fail to return the same to the owner in accordance with the terms of the agreement between the bailee and the owner thereof, or shall wilfully destroy the same, or permit it to be destroyed, although he shall not break bulk or otherwise determine the bailment, he shall be guilty of larceny, and punished as is provided in cases of larceny of like property.
