AN ACT

Fixing the salaries of real estate assessors in counties of the first class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That on and after the first day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, in counties of the first class, the annual salary of each real estate assessor, appointed by the board of revision of taxes in the said counties, shall be five thousand dollars (\$5,000), payable as now provided by law for the payment of salaries of officials and employes in said counties.

Section 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

To further amend section three, approved the twentieth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred and eighty-one), entitled "An act to amend sections two, fourteen and twenty of an act, approved the seventh day of June, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and fifteen (Pamphlet Laws, nine hundred), entitled 'An act to provide for the immediate registration of all births and deaths throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by means of certificates of births and deaths, and burial or removal permits; requiring prompt returns to the Central Bureau of Vital Statistics, as required to be established by the State Department of Health; and, in order to secure prompt and faithful registration of births, marriages, deaths, and diseases, of practitioners of medicine and surgery, of midwives, nurses, and undertakers, and of all persons whose occupation is deemed to be of importance in obtaining complete registration of births, deaths, marriages, and diseases throughout the State, as provided in section ten of an act, entitled "An act creating the Department of Health and defining its powers and duties," approved the twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and five, and providing penalties for violations of this act.'"

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section three of the act, approved the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred eighty-one), entitled "An act to amend sections two, fourteen and twenty of an act, approved the seventh day of June, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and fifteen (Pamphlet Laws, nine hundred), entitled 'An act to provide for the immediate registration of all births and deaths throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by means of certificates of births and deaths, and burial or removal permits; requiring prompt returns to the Central Bureau of Vital Statistics, as required to be established by the State Department of Health; and, in order to secure prompt and faithful registration of births, marriages, deaths, and diseases, of practitioners of medicine and

Section 20 of act of June 7, 1915 (P. L. 900), last amended by act of April 20, 1921 (P. L. 181), further amended.

surgery, of midwives, nurses, and undertakers, and of all persons whose occupation is deemed to be of importance in obtaining complete registration of births, deaths, marriages, and diseases throughout the State as provided in section ten of an act, entitled "An act creating the Department of Health and defining its powers and duties," approved the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, and providing penalties for violations of this act," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fee for certificate.

Section 20. That each registrar shall be entitled to be paid the sum of [twenty-five] *fifty* cents for each birth or death certificate properly and completely made out and registered with him and correctly copied and duly returned by him to the State Registrar, as required by this act:

Proviso.

Provided, That in cities of the first and second class, the expense of birth and death registration shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Department of Health, in such manner as other payments are made for general purposes; and, in case no births or deaths were registered during any month, the local registrar shall be entitled to be paid the sum of [twenty-five] *fifty* cents for each report to that effect promptly made in accordance with this act. All amounts payable to registrars, except in cities of the first and second class, as provided in this section, shall be paid by the treasurer of the county in which the registration districts are located, upon certification by the State Registrar, and the State Registrar shall annually certify to the treasurers of the several counties the number of births and deaths registered, with the names of the local registrars, and the amount due each at the rates fixed herein.
