Section 2. That said act be amended by adding there- section 16

to section sixteen, to read as follows:

Section 16. Any money realized from the sale of any products of said schools, or the farms connected therewith, or for the maintenance of children from other products, etc. counties, may be used by said board of managers for Use. such purposes as, in its discretion, it may decide will further the interests of the school. At the end of each Accounting. calendar year, all such money shall be properly accounted for to the county commissioners or the county controller of such county by the filing of paid vouchers, properly approved, or by depositing in the county treasury in cash such balances as may remain at the end of the said each calendar year.

#### AN ACT

Ceding to the United States of America, subject to certain limitations, jurisdiction over a tract of land acquired or to be acquired for the construction thereon of a naval hospital.

Whereas, By an act, entitled "An act to authorize Preamble. the Secretary of the Navy to proceed with the construction of certain public works at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and for other purposes," approved February thirteen, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one (Public, No. six hundred and twenty, Seventy-first Congress), the Congress of the United States has authorized the acquisition of land and construction of hospital buildings at or in the vicinity of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and

Whereas, The United States purposes to acquire for such uses a tract or parcel of land, containing an

area not exceeding thirty acres; therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the jurisdiction U. S. Naval of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is hereby ceded Philadelphia. to the United States of America over such tract or parcel of land, not exceeding thirty acres, now or here-ceded. after to be acquired by purchase or gift at or in the vicinity of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for naval hospital uses or other uses of the United States: Provided, Plan to be That an accurate description and plan of such lands so filed with secretary of acquired shall be filed with the Secretary of Internal Internal Affairs of this Commonwealth within ninety days after the United States shall have acquired possession of the same.

Section 2. The jurisdiction so ceded to the United States of America is granted upon the express condition that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States, in and over the tracts of land aforesaid, so far that civil process in all cases, and such criminal process as may issue under the authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania against any person or persons charged with the crimes committed without the said tracts of land, may be executed thereon in the same way and manner as if this jurisdiction had not been ceded. The United States are to retain such jurisdiction as long as said tract of land shall be used for the purposes expressed in the foregoing section, and no longer.

Section 3. This act shall be effective upon the date

of its approval by the Governor.

### AN ACT

According to the United States Commissioner of Fisheries, and his agents, the right to conduct fish hatching and fish culture at a fish-cultural station established by the United States within the Commonwealth.

U.S. Fish-Cultural Station. Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby gives its consent and accords to the Government of the United States and the
