AN ACT

To amend section one of the act, approved the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, eight hundred two), entitled "An act authorizing county commissioners to repay moneys collected on forfeited recognizances in certain cases," by extending the provisions of said act to cases where the defendant is subsequently apprehended and returned to the jurisdiction of the court, and providing for the repayment of moneys collected in such cases.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of the act, approved the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, eight hundred two), entitled "An act authorizing county commissioners to repay moneys collected on forfeited recognizances in certain cases," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That in all cases where the county commissioners of any county shall collect, or have collected, any money upon any forfeited recognizance, duly estreated to such county commissioners by the clerk of the proper court *and the same has been paid into the county treasury*, and where the defendant in such case subsequently surrenders himself or herself to the jurisdiction of the proper court, *or is subsequently apprehended and returned to the jurisdiction of the court*, the county commissioners may, (a) with the consent of the district attorney, and (b) shall upon order of court in any case, repay to the party from whom such money was collected the amount so collected on such forfeited recognizance, exclusive of all costs paid or incurred by the county in such proceeding.
