PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH

(These Resolutions, ten in number, were passed the first time at the Legislative Session of 1931.)

No. C-1

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to section eighteen, article three of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section I. Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be, and the same is hereby, proposed, in accordance with the eighteenth article thereof:—

That section eighteen of article three is hereby

amended to read as follows:

Section 18. No appropriations shall be made for charitable, educational or benevolent purposes to any person or community, nor to any denominational or sectarian institution, corporation or association: Provided, That appropriations may be made for pensions or gratuities for military services: And provided further, That appropriations may be made, by general law, for assistance to mothers having dependent children and to aged persons without adequate means of support by reason of indigency, disease, infirmity or other disability.
