

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section, or any other provisions of this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or to suffer imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

Section 11. Right of Dentists to Practice as Dental Hygienists; [Rights of Dental Laboratories and Mechanics] *Dental Supplies*.—Nothing contained in this act shall be construed as prohibiting a duly licensed and registered dentist from performing the work of a dental hygienist. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed to prevent any [dental laboratory or dental mechanic] *person, copartnership, association or corporation* from manufacturing and furnishing to, or *repairing for*, licensed and registered dentists artificial teeth, crowns, bridges, prosthetic work, and regulating appliances, but it shall be unlawful and constitute the practice of dentistry for any [dental mechanic or person employed in a dental laboratory or for any other] person to fit, or attempt to fit, or to furnish to *or repair for* any other person artificial teeth, crowns, bridges, prosthetic work, or appliances.

Section 2. The provisions of this act are severable, and if any of its provisions are declared unconstitutional, the decision so holding shall not be construed as impairing any other provision of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional provisions not been included therein.

AN ACT

To amend section one, section two, and section five of an act, approved the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred and fifty-five), entitled "An act providing for the regulation of dams, or other structures or obstructions, as defined herein, in, along, across, or projecting into all streams and bodies of water wholly or partly within, or forming part of the boundary of, this Commonwealth; vesting certain powers and duties in the Water Supply Commission of Pennsylvania, for this purpose; and providing penalties for the violation of the provisions hereof," further defining water obstructions; and enlarging the powers and duties of the Water and Power Resources Board by further providing for the regulation of any changes that in any manner diminish the course, current or cross section of any stream or body of water.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of the act, approved the twenty-fifth day of June, one thou-

sand nine hundred and thirteen (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred and fifty-five), entitled "An act providing for the regulation of dams, or other structures or obstructions, as defined herein, in, along, across, or projecting into all streams and bodies of water wholly or partly within, or forming part of the boundary of, this Commonwealth; vesting certain powers and duties in the Water Supply Commission of Pennsylvania, for this purpose; and providing penalties for the violation of the provisions hereof," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Dams, structures  
and obstructions.

Section 1. That the term "water obstruction," as used in this act, includes any dam, wall, wing-wall, wharf, embankment, abutment, projection, *bridge*, or similar or analogous structure, or any other obstruction whatsoever, in, along, across, or projecting into *or being in* any stream or body of water wholly or partly within, or forming part of the boundary of, this Commonwealth, except the tidal waters of the Delaware River and of its navigable tributaries.

The word "construct" shall be taken to mean construct, erect, build, place, or deposit.

Section 2. That section two of said act is hereby amended to read as follows:

Construction  
changes, etc.

Section 2. From and after the passage of this act, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, partnership, association, corporation, county, city, borough, town, or township to construct any dam or other water obstruction; or to make or construct, or permit to be made or constructed, any change therein or addition thereto; or to make, or permit to be made, any change in or addition to any existing water obstruction; or in any manner to change or diminish the course, current, or cross section of any stream or body of water, wholly or partly within, or forming a part of the boundary of, this Commonwealth, except the tidal waters of the Delaware River and of its navigable tributaries, without the consent or permit of the [Water Supply Commission of Pennsylvania] *Water and Power Resources Board*, in writing, previously obtained, upon written application to said [Commission therefor] *board* therefor.

Section 3. That section five of said act is hereby amended to read as follows:

Investigation.

Section 5. Upon complaint, or upon its own initiative, the [Commission] *Water and Power Resources Board* shall have power to cause an investigation or examination to be made of any dam, or other water obstruction now existing or hereafter constructed. If the [Commission] *board* shall determine that such dam or water obstruction is unsafe or needs repair, *alteration or change in its structure or location*, or should be removed as being unsafe and not susceptible of repair, *or for any*

*reason is derogatory to the regimen of the stream, the [Commission] board shall, in writing, notify the owner or owners thereof to repair, alter, change its structure or location, or remove the same, as the exigencies of the case may require; such work to be commenced and proceeded with to completion within such reasonable time as may be prescribed in such notice by the [Commission] board; [And] and it shall thereupon be and become the duty of such owner or owners to comply with the provisions of such notice.*

Notice to repair or remove.

If said owner or owners, notified as aforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to make such repairs, alterations, change or changes in structure or location or to cause such removal, or if said owner or owners cannot be found or determined, then [it shall be and become the duty of the Commission to] *the Board may make such repairs, alterations, change or changes in structure or location or cause such removal; and the [Commission] board may thereafter recover, in the name of the Commonwealth, from the owner or owners, the said cost or expense, in the same manner as debts are now by law recoverable.*

Neglect or refusal.

*It is the legislative intent that the provisions of this act shall extend to and include all types of water obstructions, regardless of the date when they were constructed, and whether or not the same were constructed by permission, express or implied, of the Commonwealth, or of any authorized agency thereof, and whether temporary or permanent, and to all changes in the course, current or cross section of any stream or body of water, whether such change be temporary or permanent. The Water and Power Resources Board is authorized and empowered to hold hearings, subpoena witnesses, perform any and all such acts, make and enforce such rules and regulations, and issue such orders, not inconsistent with this act, as it may deem necessary and proper for carrying out the purposes of this act.*
