provided for, and to make the necessary certificates in like manner and to the same intent, effect, and purpose as the same could be done by said president judge.

(d) No judge of the county court in and for the county of Allegheny who shall render services as herein provided, shall receive any extra compensation or remuneration* for such services in addition to the salary provided for the services of such judge as a judge of the county court in and for the county of Allegheny.

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

Section 3. All acts or parts of acts which are inconsistent herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To establish a separate orphans' court in and for the county of Dauphin.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That in the county of Dauphin a separate orphans' court be and is hereby established. The name and style of which shall be the Orphans' Court of Dauphin County, which court shall be a court of record, and shall consist of one judge learned in the law.

Section 2. At the first municipal election which shall occur after the passage of this act, a judge of the said court shall be elected and duly commissioned to hold office from the first Monday of January next succeeding such election for the same term and in the same manner as the judges of the court of common pleas of the county. The annual salary of the said judge shall be the same as is paid to the judges of the court of common pleas of the said county, and shall be paid in the same manner as the salaries of said judges of the court of common pleas are now or may be hereafter made by law payable.

Section 3. The terms of the said orphans' court shall be established by the judge thereof as he shall deem necessary and proper.

Section 4. The said court shall have and exercise all the jurisdiction and powers now vested in, or which may hereafter be conferred upon, the orphans' courts of this Commonwealth under and by virtue of the laws thereof.

phans' court shall be held and its business transacted, and in which the records thereof shall be safely and securely kept.
