AN ACT

To repeal the act, approved the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred sixty-eight (Pamphlet Laws, fifty-five), entitled "A supplement to an act, entitled 'An act to increase the revenues of the Commonwealth by taxation of the shares of stock of the national banks,' approved April twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven."

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the act, approved the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred sixty-eight (Pamphlet Laws, fifty-five), entitled "A supplement to an act, entitled 'An act to increase the revenues of the Commonwealth by taxation of the shares of stock of the national banks,' approved April twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven," be, and the same is hereby, repealed.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend section one of the act, approved the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (Pamphlet Laws, fifty), entitled "An act to permit disabled soldiers to peddle by procuring a license therefor, without charge," as amended, prohibiting the peddling of labeled flowers of certain veteran's organizations and miniature American flags.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of the act, approved the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (Pamphlet Laws, fifty), entitled "An act to permit disabled soldiers to peddle by procuring a license therefor, without charge," as last amended by the act, approved the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred twenty-six), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That every honorably discharged soldier, sailor, and marine, of the military or naval service of the United States, who is a resident of this State, and who is unable to procure a livelihood by
