AN ACT

To amend clause (b) of section four hundred forty-eight of the act, approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred seventyseven), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the ad-ministrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be deter-mined," as amended, changing the personnel of the State Veterans Commission.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That clause (b) of Clause (b) of section four hundred forty-eight of the act, approved of April 9, 1929 the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and (P. L. 177), as twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred seventy-seven), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing (P. L. 1471), further amended. the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," as amended by the act, approved the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand four hundred seventy-one), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

(b) The State Veterans Commission shall consist of State Veterans

the Adjutant General, ex officio, and [five] seven members, all of whom shall have served in the armed forces of the United States while a state of war existed between the United States of America and another sovereign power, and shall be members in good and regular standing of a Pennsylvania branch, post, lodge, or club, of a recognized national veterans organization active in this Commonwealth.

[Three] *Five* members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

The commission shall select from its number a chairman and a secretary.

AN ACT

To amend sections three and seven as amended, and section nine of the act, approved the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred fifty-two), entitled "An act to promote the welfare of the people of the Commonwealth; creating a General State Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to construct, improve, and operate projects, and to lease the same, and to fix and collect fees, rentals, and charges for the use thereof; authorizing and regulating the issuance of bonds by said Authority, and providing for the payment of such bonds, and the rights of the holders thereof; and to enter into agreements with the Government of the United States or any Federal agency; and authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to grant, assign, convey, or lease to the Authority lands of the Commonwealth and interests therein, and to acquire lands therefor; granting the right of eminent domain; and providing that no debt of the Commonwealth shall be incurred in the exercise of any of the powers granted by this act," by changing the personnel of the governing body; fixing the quorum thereof; and clarifying the powers of the Department of Property and Supplies.

Sections 3 and 7, act of June 28, 1935 (P. L. 452), as amended by act of May 18, 1937 (Act No. 178), further amended.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That sections three and seven of the act, approved the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred fifty-two), entitled "An act to promote the welfare of the people of the Commonwealth; creating a General State Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to construct, improve, and operate projects, and to lease the same, and to fix and collect fees, rentals, and charges for the use thereof; authorizing and regulating the issuance of bonds by said Authority, and providing for the payment of such bonds, and the rights of the holders thereof; and to enter into agreements with the Government of the United States or any Federal agency; and authorizing the Department
