To repeal certain parts of acts relating to struck juries.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the following parts certain acts of acts of Assembly are hereby repealed absolutely:

Defining the method of computing the aggregate minimum and maximum limits of consecutive sentences imposed upon persons convicted of crime.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That whenever, after Method of comthe effective date of this act, two or more sentences to puting sentences in criminal cases run consecutively are imposed by any court of this Com- stated. monwealth upon any person convicted of crime therein, there shall be deemed to be imposed upon such person a sentence the minimum of which shall be the total of the minimum limits of the several sentences so imposed, and the maximum of which shall be the total of the maximum limits of such sentences.

When effective. Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend section three of article twelve of the act, approved the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred eighty-one), entitled "An act for the better government of cities of the first class of this Commonwealth," by further defining the powers and duties of the city controller; imposing limitations on the powers of and duties on departments and officers; regulating commitments; and providing for the audit of firemen's pension funds.

Section 3 of article 12, act of June 25, 1919 (P. L. 581), amended. Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section three of article twelve of the act, approved the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred eighty-one), entitled "An act for the better government of cities of the first class of this Commonwealth," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. (a) [The eity controller shall prescribe the form of reports and accounts to be rendered to his department, and shall have entire charge and supervision of the accounts of all other departments and trusts. All employes engaged in the keeping of any of the books or accounts prescribed by the city controller or forming part of the city's bookkeeping system, shall be under the control and supervision of the city controller.] In addition to all other powers and duties, the city controller shall—

(1) Keep all accounting or financial records of all departments of the city government, and of all other departments, the expenses of which are paid out of the city treasury.

(2) Have power to require such additional and supporting, accounting or financial records to be kept and to be rendered to his department by the other departments of the city government, the expenses of which are paid out of the city treasury, as may to him seem necessary, and shall prescribe the nature, form, and extent of all such supporting records. He shall have complete supervision and control over such records and accounts. All employes engaged in the keeping of any of the books or accounts prescribed by the city controller, or forming part of the city's bookkeeping system, shall be under the control and supervision of the city controller.
