Winterstown, Yoe, and Yorkana shall constitute the third district, and shall elect one member.

Based on 1930 United States Census. Section 2. The foregoing apportionment is based on the United States decennial census of one thousand nine hundred and thirty. Any township, borough, or ward created since such census, and not specifically provided for by this act, shall form a part of the district to which the territory comprised within such township, borough, or ward is allotted by the provisions of this act, according to the political division existing at the time of such census.

General election 1938. Section 3. The first election under this act shall be held at the general election in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

Present terms.

The Members of the House of Representatives now in office shall continue in such office until the expiration of their respective terms.

AN ACT

To fix the number of Senators in the General Assembly of the State; to apportion the State into senatorial districts as provided by the Constitution; and to regulate the election of, and the terms of office of, the present and future elected Senators.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That until the next United States decennial census is taken and an apportionment made thereon, the Senate shall consist of fifty members, and the State is hereby apportioned into fifty senatorial districts, each of which shall be known by the number herein attached thereto, and shall each be entitled to elect one Senator, as follows, to wit:

The Senators now in office shall continue in such office until the expiration of the terms for which they were elected.
