

any false or misleading information to the [county treasurer] *issuing agents* or to the [Commissioner, his] *Department of Revenue, its officers, or agents* in the application therefor.

Section 7. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

Section 8. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

AN ACT

Providing for the reciprocal enforcement of violations of the fishing laws in boundary waters between Pennsylvania and the States of New York and New Jersey.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That if and when the State of New York shall enact a similar law for the arrest and punishment of violations of the conservation or fish laws of this Commonwealth or the State of New York, committed or attempted to be committed by any person or persons fishing in that portion of the Delaware River lying between such states, any game protector, fish warden or other person of either state who is authorized to make arrests for violations of the conservation or fish laws of such states shall have power and authority to make arrests on any part of such river between such states or the shores thereof, and to take the person or persons so arrested for trial to the state in which the violation was committed, and there to prosecute such person or persons according to the laws of such state.

If State of New York enacts similar law.

Game officials of either state authorized to make arrests on any part of river lying between the States.

Trial in the state where the violation committed.

Section 2. If and when the State of New Jersey shall enact a similar law for the arrest and punishment of violations of the conservation or fish laws of this Commonwealth or the State of New Jersey, committed or attempted to be committed by any person or persons fishing in that portion of the Delaware River lying between such states, any game protector, fish warden or other person of either state who is authorized to make arrests for violation of the conservation or fish laws of such states shall have power and authority to make arrests on any part of such river between such states or the shores thereof, and to take the person or persons so arrested for trial to the state in which the violation was committed, and there to prosecute such person or persons according to the laws of such state.

If State of New Jersey enacts similar law, provisions of section one apply.

When effective. Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

Empowering the Department of Property and Supplies, with the consent and approval of the Department of Military Affairs and the Governor, to lease or rent a part or parts of the Pennsylvania Military Reservation at Indiantown Gap to the City of Harrisburg for the purpose of impounding water for a water supply; and appropriating the moneys received therefrom to the Department of Military Affairs.

Empowering lease of part of Pennsylvania Military Reservation at Indiantown Gap to the City of Harrisburg for water supply purposes.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Department of Property and Supplies, with the consent of the Department of Military Affairs and subject to the approval of the Governor, is hereby empowered to lease or rent a part or parts of the Military Reservation at Indiantown Gap, located in Lebanon and Dauphin Counties, to the City of Harrisburg, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of impounding water for a water supply and in connection therewith the construction of a dam, roadways, bridges, tunnels, pipe lines, and other appurtenances. The lease or rental agreement shall be approved by the Governor, and as to form by the Attorney General.

Disposition of rentals.

Section 2. All moneys received from any such lease or rental shall be paid, through the Department of Revenue, into the General Fund of the State Treasury, and shall be added and credited to the current biennial appropriation of the Department of Military Affairs, and shall be available and is hereby appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the purchase of additional land to be used for or in connection with the Military Reservation at Indiantown Gap, and for the payment of labor and the purchase of supplies, material, and equipment deemed necessary for the construction, improvement and repair of buildings, roads, and utility improvements, and of additions thereto.

When effective.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.
