

## No. 104-A.

## AN ACT

Making an appropriation, out of The State Stores Fund, to the Department of Property and Supplies for the acquisition of land (with or without buildings thereon), and for the erection, construction, and equipment of an office building thereon for the use of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of The State Stores Fund to the Department of Property and Supplies for the purchase, in the name of the Commonwealth, of land (with or without buildings thereon), and for the erection, construction, and equipment of an office building thereon suitable for the proper conduct of the administrative work of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board. The Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to select the land to be used for the purposes of this act: Provided, That such land shall be situated in the City of Harrisburg, of this Commonwealth. The title to any land acquired hereunder shall be approved by the Attorney General. The procedure for the acquisition of land and the erection, construction, and equipment of the office building authorized in this act shall be in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the act, approved the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred seventy-seven), designated as "The Administrative Code of 1929."

Section 2. The appropriation made by this act shall be available for the payment of the cost of necessary plans, specifications, advertising for bids, supervision, and architectural and engineering fees required for the purposes of this act.

Section 3. Any balance of the appropriation made by this act that remains unexpended and unencumbered on May 31, one thousand nine hundred forty-one, shall lapse into The State Stores Fund upon that date.

APPROVED—The 2d day of July, A. D. 1937, with this condition: That under the powers of the Governor, contained in Article VI of the Administrative Code, approval of the expenditure authorized by this appropriation will be withheld until it is certain that the profits from the operation of the State Stores will exceed the amount estimated in the budget to be payable into the General Fund during the current biennium. I shall not approve any disbursements under this appropriation until such excess profits are apparent. The Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board informs me that it is possible the profits from the Stores' operations may exceed the amount which they had estimated would be transferred to the General Fund. For this reason and under this condition I approve the bill.

## No. 105-A.

## AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for use in research work dealing with human nutrition for children.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the sum of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for the use of the Land Grant College of Pennsylvania, engaged by the Department for the purpose of advancing research in human nutrition for children, so as to continue the work now in progress in certain areas and in order that this research may be extended into other areas. The Department of Health shall commission this research to an institution, college, or university, and remain in an advisory capacity so as to benefit and be directed in its work by such findings as may ensue. The moneys so appropriated may be advanced to the Land Grant College of Pennsylvania at such time or times and in such amount or amounts as the college shall request.
