

order of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the adoption procedure shall not be deemed to have been completed until an order has been first obtained from said commission, under and in accordance with the Public Utility Law approving such crossing, or* which shall determine and prescribe the points at which and the manner in which such crossing shall be constructed, altered, relocated or abolished, or the manner and conditions in or under which the crossing shall be maintained, operated and protected, to effectuate the prevention of accidents and the promotion of the safety of the public.

Description
and plan.

Section 3. Whenever a road or highway is adopted and taken over under the provisions of this act, the Department of Highways or unit of government adopting the same as a public road or highway, shall cause a description and plan thereof to be made, showing the center line of the road or highway and the established width thereof, as fixed at the time when the same was established as a highway in the exercise of the war power, and shall cause such description and plan to be acknowledged by the officer or agent of the department or unit of government making such description and plan. Thereupon such description, plan and acknowledgment shall be recorded in the office of the recorder of deeds of the county in which the road or highway is located in the book in which descriptions of highways are recorded. The Department of Highways or unit of Government shall also enter such description and plan on any general plan of its highways, roads, streets and alleys which it is required by law to maintain.

Recording.

Section 4. Any highway adopted and taken over under the provisions of this act shall thereafter be a public road or highway as fully to all intents and purposes as though the same had been laid out, opened and constructed under and in accordance with the laws of this Commonwealth.

AN ACT

To further amend section eleven of the act, approved the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws, six hundred forty-four), entitled "An act relating to and regulating the solicitation of moneys and property for charitable, religious, benevolent, humane, and patriotic

purposes," by providing that said act shall not apply to certain war veterans' organizations or the subordinate units thereof.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section eleven of the act, approved the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws, six hundred forty-four), entitled "An act relating to and regulating the solicitation of moneys and property for charitable, religious, benevolent, humane, and patriotic purposes," as amended by the act, approved the twenty-second day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws, eight hundred seventy-one), is hereby further* amended to read as follows:

Section 11. This act shall not apply to fraternal organizations incorporated under the laws of the Commonwealth, religious organizations, raising funds for religious purposes, colleges, schools, universities, labor unions, municipalities, or subdivisions thereof, nor to charitable institutions or agencies required by the provisions of existing law to file reports with the Department of Welfare or with any other department or office of the Commonwealth, *nor to any war veterans' organization or any subordinate units thereof, whenever the purpose for which it is soliciting funds has been approved by the Department of Military Affairs.*

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To add section six hundred ninety-nine and seven-tenths to the act, approved the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, eight hundred seventy-two), entitled "An act to consolidate, amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth," making it unlawful to capture, take or have in one's possession lobsters under a certain size.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Article six of the act, approved the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, eight hundred seventy-two), entitled "An act to consolidate, amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth," is hereby
