of the State, that the said company or companies have satisfactorily passed the annual inspection provided by law. The moneys so appropriated shall be used and expended solely and exclusively for the support and maintenance, discipline and training of the said company, battalion, regiment, or similar organization; and the commanding officer shall account, by the proper vouchers to the said city each year, for the expenditure of the money so appropriated, and no appropriation shall be made for any subsequent year until the expenditure of the previous year is duly and satisfactorily accounted for.

The accounts of such expenditures shall be subject to the inspection of the Department of Military Affairs, and shall be audited by the [Auditor General in the manner provided by law for the audit of accounts of State moneys] controller of the city.

Section 2, act of March 10, 1937, P. L. 39, amended. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
