## AN ACT

To amend section 1512 of the act, approved the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three (Pamphlet Laws 103) entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," by requiring water utility companies to furnish to townships, lists of water meter readings, flat-rate bills and other data for the purpose of determining sewer charges, and providing reimbursement for their expenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1512 of the act, approved the first Section 1512, act day of May, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three (Pamphlet Laws 103), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto,' as reenacted and amended by the act, approved the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1481), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1512. Sewer Rentals.—All persons whose property connects with a system of sewers or drains shall pay to the township treasurer, in addition to the cost of making such connection, a monthly, quarterly, semiannual or annual charge prescribed by a resolution of the board of supervisors. Such monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual charge or charges shall constitute a lien until paid against the property so connecting with such system, and the amount thereof may be recovered by due process of law. All water utilities supplying water to users within the boundaries of any township shall, at the request of the board of supervisors, furnish to the township, on or before the fifteenth day of the month following the month during which bills are issued, a list of all water meter readings and flat-rate water bills and the basis for each flat-rate water charge, so that the data may be used in calculating such charges. The township is authorized and empowered to pay to such utilities reasonable amounts for necessary clerical and other expenses incurred in the preparation of such lists.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to repeal or modify any of the provisions of the Public Utility Law.
