possession of explosives shall be required to have a license for each magazine used for the storing or placing of explosives, which license shall be issued on a form prepared and furnished by the Department of Labor and Industry. The application for license shall be accompanied by the proper license fee, which shall be prescribed by the department, according to the quantity of explosives which are to be stored or placed in the magazine, and shall not be less than [two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50)] three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) nor more than [twenty-five (\$25)] fifty dollars (\$50). Such license shall be kept posted conspicuously in or about the magazine for which issued. Licenses shall expire annually on the thirty-first day of December, and shall be renewed annually upon payment of the fee as specified in this section.

## AN ACT

To further amend sections four, five and ten of the act, approved the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred twentynine (Pamphlet Laws 1518), entitled, as amended, "An act regulating the construction, equipment, maintenance, operation and inspection of elevators; granting certain authority to and imposing certain duties upon the Department of Labor and Industry; providing fees for inspection of elevators, certificates of operation, and approval of plans; providing penalties for \*violations of this act; and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act," by increasing certain fees.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections four and five of the act. approved the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 1518). entitled. as amended, "An act regulating the construction, equipment, maintenance, operation and inspection of elevators; granting certain authority to and imposing certain duties upon the Department of Labor and Industry; providing fees for inspection of elevators, certificates of operation, and approval of plans; providing penalties for violations of this act; and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act," as amended and reenacted by the act, approved the eighth

day of April, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 277), are hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Examination of Inspectors and Fees Therefor.—No person shall inspect elevators unless he has passed a written examination prescribed by the department. Application for examination shall be made in writing, upon a form furnished by the department, and shall be accompanied by an examination fee of [ten] fifteen dollars (\$15). If the applicant is successful in passing the said examination, a certificate of competency and a commission shall be issued upon the payment of an additional fee of [five dollars] seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50). All inspectors shall be required to secure a new credential card each year, by application to the department, which application shall be accompanied by The Secretary of a fee of [two] three dollars (\$3). Labor and Industry may suspend any commission for due cause, but no commission may be revoked until the inspector has been granted a hearing.

Section 5. Inspection of Insured Elevators.—If an elevator is insured by a company authorized to insure elevators in this Commonwealth against loss from accident, the inspection may be made by an employe of such company, and the only fee collectible by the Commonwealth shall be the certificate fee of [one dollar] two dollars (\$2) hereinafter provided for in this act.

Section 2. Section ten of said act, as last amended by the act, approved the twenty-first day of June, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 791), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 10. Fees for Inspection.—The fee for the certificate of operation for all insured and uninsured elevators shall be [two dollars (\$2)] three dollars (\$3). When elevators are inspected by inspectors of the department, the following fee shall be charged in addition to the certificate fee:

For passenger elevators, fees not exceeding [eighteen dollars (\$18)] twenty dollars (\$20) per annum.

For freight elevators, including gravity elevators, fees not exceeding [nine (\$9) dollars] ten dollars (\$10) per annum.

For dumb-waiters, hoists and other lifting apparatus, fees not exceeding [four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50)] five dollars (\$5) per annum.

For building hoists, fees not exceeding [four dollars and fifty cents (\$4.50)] five dollars (\$5) for each inspection.
