Section 5. At the municipal election to be held in Election of judge one thousand nine hundred fifty-five, a judge of the orphans' court shall be elected and duly commissioned to hold office from the first Monday of January next succeeding such election, for the same term and in the same manner as the judges of the court of common pleas of the county. The annual salary of said judge and the Annual salary manner of payment shall be the same as is paid to the judges of the court of common pleas of said county.

Section 6. The Governor is hereby authorized to Governor authorappoint one competent person learned in the law as judge of said orphans' court, to serve until the first Mon-ment. day in January next succeeding the municipal election to be held in one thousand nine hundred fifty-five.

Section 7. The provisions of this act shall become Act effective effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to execute on behalf of the Commonwealth a compact with certain other States for the effective prevention and control of forest fires and for mutual aid in fighting forest fires.

Forest fires.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Governor authorized to execute compact with certain other States for prevention and control of forest fires and for mutual aid in fighting them.

Section 1. The Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is hereby authorized and directed to execute a compact on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with any one or more of the States of Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Virginia and West Virginia, who may, by their legislative bodies, so authorize a compact, in form substantially as follows:

Form of compact.

Middle Atlantic Interstate Forest Fire Protection Compact

Article I

The purpose of this compact is to promote effective prevention and control of forest fires in the Middle Atlantic region of the United States by the development of integrated forest fire plans, by the maintenance of adequate forest fire fighting services by the member States, and by providing for mutual aid in fighting forest fires among the compacting States of the region and with States which are party to other regional forest fire protection compacts or agreements.

Article II

This compact shall become operative immediately as to those States ratifying it whenever any two or more of the States of Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia which are contiguous have ratified it and Congress has given consent thereto.
