AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to transfer a trunk sanitary sewer line and grant a right of way or easement to the Borough of Hollidaysburg, across lands between the Hollidaysburg State Hospital and a point in the Borough of Hollidaysburg.

Borough of Hollidaysburg.

Department of Property and Supplies authorized to transfer a trunk sanitary sewer line and grant right of way to said borough, etc., in Blair County. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to transfer a trunk sanitary sewer line and to grant and confirm a perpetual right of way or easement to the Borough of Hollidaysburg to maintain said sanitary sewer line, and to occupy or to continue to occupy a right of way over lands between the Hollidaysburg State Hospital and a point in the Borough of Hollidaysburg, situate partly in the township of Allegheny and partly in the borough of Hollidaysburg, County of Blair and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, more particularly described as follows:

Description of right of way.

Beginning at a manhole on the property of the Commonwealth at the Hollidaysburg State Hospital; thence north 45 degrees 42 minutes west a distance of 1336.60 feet; thence north 57 degrees one minute west a distance of 1010.69 feet; thence north 67 degrees 53 minutes west a distance of 398.01 feet; thence south 89 degrees 58 minutes west a distance of 732.40 feet; thence north 80 degrees 6 minutes west a distance of 400 feet; thence north 43 degrees a distance of 1336 feet to a manhole in Garber Street; thence south 67 degrees 30 minutes west a distance of 234.70 feet: thence north 61 degrees 15 minutes west a distance of 42 feet to a connection with the Hollidaysburg Sewer System, a total distance of 5490.4 feet and 5 feet in width, a total of approximately .63 acres; such right of way being for the purpose of maintaining a trunk line sewer.

Right of way herein described acquired under provisions of act of September 29, 1938, P. L. 53.

The right of way herein described was acquired by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania under the provisions of the act, approved the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand nine hundred thirty-eight (Pamphlet Laws 53), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to institutions of counties, cities, wards, boroughs, townships, institution districts and other political subdivisons, for the care, maintenance, and treatment of mental patients; providing for the transfer to the Commonwealth for the care, maintenance and treatment of mental patients of such institutions, and all grounds, lands, buildings and personal property of such political subdivisions used for the care and maintenance of indigent

persons connected with such mental institutions; providing for the management and operation or closing and abandonment thereof; and the maintenance of mental patients therein; including the collection of maintenance in certain cases; providing for the retransfer of certain property to counties, cities, wards, boroughs, townships, institution districts and other political subdivisions under certain circumstances; conferring and imposing upon the Governor, the Department of Welfare, the courts of common pleas and counties, cities, wards, boroughs, townships, institution districts and other political subdivisions certain powers and duties; prohibiting cities, counties, wards, boroughs, townships, institution districts and other political subdivisions from maintaining and operating institutions, in whole or in part, for the care and treatment of mental patients; and repealing inconsistent laws."

Section 2. The Borough of Hollidaysburg shall maintain the trunk sewage line and continue its use for the Hollidaysburg State Hospital, and should the Borough of Hollidaysburg cease to operate and maintain the said trunk sewage line, all rights granted herein shall revert to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The deed granting the right of way or Section 3. easement shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The provisions of this act shall become Section 4. effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend the act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 28), entitled "An act relating to the civil defense of this State and its coordination with national defense; providing for the establishment of a State Council of Civil Defense, local and district councils of civil defense, Mobile Support Units; prescribing the powers, duties and immunities thereof and of their personnel; authorizing mutual aid compacts, and providing penalties, by providing for immunity from liability for certain acts.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsections (d) and (e) of section 5 of the subsections (d) act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand (e) of secsand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 28), en. March 19, 1951, titled "An act relating to the civil defense of this State." P. L. 28, retitled "An act relating to the civil defense of this State pealed."

Borough to maintain trunk sewage line and continue its use for Hollidaysburg State Hospital.

Reversion.

Approval and execution of deed.

Act effective immediately.
