garded as in derogation of any powers now existing. Such sections, being necessary for the welfare of the Commonwealth and its inhabitants, shall be liberally construed to effect the purposes thereof.

Section 20. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent Inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Section 21. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 53 AN ACT

Amending the act of May one, one thousand nine hundred twentynine (Pamphlet Laws 905), entitled "An act for the protection of the public safety; regulating the use of highways, and the operation of vehicles, tractors, street cars, trackless trolley omnibuses, bicycles, pedestrians, and the riding of animals upon the highways of this Commonwealth; providing for the titling, including liens, encumbrances, and legal claims; registration of certain vehicles, and licensing the operators thereof, upon payment of prescribed fees, prescribing and limiting the powers of local authorities to deal with the subject matter of this act; conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue, the Department of Highways, peace officers, mayors, burgesses, magistrates, aldermen, justices of the peace, the courts and the clerks thereof, owners of vehicles, and garage keepers; providing that records are admissible as evidence; imposing upon owners, counties, cities, boroughs, incorporated towns, townships, within the Commonwealth, liability for damages caused by the negligent operation of their motor vehicles; imposing penalties; imposing certain costs upon counties; providing for the disposition of fines, forfeitures, fees, and miscellaneous receipts; making an appropriation and providing for refunds," fixing fees for special hauling permits for delivery of certain vehicles from place of manufacture within the Commonwealth.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Penn- "The Vehicle Code." sylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The act of May one, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 905), known as "The Vehicle Code," is amended by adding after section 719.1 a new section to read:

Section 719.2. Special Hauling Permits For Delivery of Certain Vehicles From Manufacturer.-The fee for a special hauling permit for delivery of a house trailer which exceeds the maximum size or weight prescribed in this act, from the place of manufacture within this Commonwealth to its initial destination, either by or for the manufacturer or the purchaser, shall be five (\$5) dollars payable to the authorities issuing the permit.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
