AN ACT

Amending the act of June eleven, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws 326), entitled "An act relating to counties of the first class; defining deceased service persons; providing for contributions by the county to the funeral expenses for such persons and their widows; providing for the erection and care of markers, headstones, and flags, and for the compilation of war records," authorizing The Italian-American World War Veterans of the United States Incorporated, Department of Pennsylvania, to collect certain data relative to location of burial places of deceased service persons.

Section 10. Voluntary Assistance by Veterans' Organizations .-- For the purpose of locating the burial places of deceased service persons, the Grand Army of the Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, the American Legion, the Disabled American Veterans, the American Veterans of World War II (AMVETS), [and] the Marine Corps League and The Italian-American World War Veterans of the United States Incorporated, Department of Pennsylvania, through their local camps, posts, and branches in this State, are authorized, without expense to the county, to collect the required data, and prepare and file with the county commissioners. certificates embodying the information provided for in this section.
